GENERAL GUIDELINES

- Applicants must be members of the Intercollegiate Studies Institute who receive *The Intercollegiate Review*.
- The postmark deadline for all Graduate Fellowship application materials is **January 17** of the year in which the fellowship will be awarded. The ISI Graduate Fellows will be announced in April. ISI will notify each applicant by mail.
- Applicants must engage in graduate studies for the purpose of teaching at the college level.
- Applicants must be U.S. citizens, who will be enrolled in a graduate fellowship for the coming academic year.
- Those attending pre-professional (medical, law, divinity, business, etc.) schools are ineligible.
- Applicants may apply for more than one fellowship in any given academic cycle. For each fellowship sought, applicants must submit separate copies of all components of the application.
- Previous recipients may compete for future ISI Graduate Fellowships without restriction.

ASSEMBLE THE FOLLOWING:

- I. Four brief statements:
 - a. Why applicant has chosen teaching as a profession
 - b. Why applicant desires fellowship
 - c. Signed declaration of intent to teach
 - d. How applicant heard about the ISI Fellowship Program

- II. A 1 page outline of prior education, awards, fellowships, and internships

- III. Three essays (must be 12 point standard font, and double spaced):
 - a. An essay (five to ten pages) written on the theme of the fellowship for which the applicant is applying
 - Richard M. Weaver Fellowship theme: Education and a Free Society
 - Bache Renshaw Fellowship theme: Education and a Free Society
 - Henry Salvatori Fellowship theme: The American Founding and a Free Society
 - Western Civilization Fellowship theme: Liberty and the Western Idea
 - b. Personal, philosophical, professional autobiography (3-5 pages)
 - c. Copy of paper submitted for university coursework (ten pages maximum)

- IV. Three letters of academic recommendation (must be sent by the recommender and turned in with "Letter of Recommendation" form.)

- V. All graduate (if applicable) and undergraduate college transcripts (may be mailed by the institution or applicant)

- VI. A 2" x 3" photo or headshot
