Local ISI Lecture on How Milton Friedman Joined the Supply-Siders to Defeat Stagflation and How the Same Lessons Apply Today in a Post-TARP World

Wilmington, DE – July 7, 2009 – The Intercollegiate Studies Institute (ISI), a national educational organization headquartered in Wilmington, Delaware, will host **Brian Domitrovic**, author of *Econoclasts: The Rebels Who Sparked the Supply-Side Revolution and Restored American Prosperity* in honor of Milton Friedmans birthday, July 31. Mr. Domitrovic holds a Ph.D. in history from Harvard, where he also did graduate work in economics. He is currently an assistant professor of history at Sam Houston State University in Huntsville, Texas.

In his talk titled “Free to Choose,” Professor Domitrovic will discuss his forthcoming book *Econoclasts* and examine the power of supply-side economics. This lecture will take place at ISI’s F.M.
