Hudson Institute Fellow, Paul Marshall, to speak at Dartmouth College

Hanover, NH – April 2, 2009 – The Intercollegiate Studies Institute (ISI), a national educational organization headquartered in Wilmington, Delaware, will host **Paul Marshall**, Senior Fellow from the Center for Religious Freedom at the Hudson Institute, who will discuss the important topic “Understanding Radical Islam.” This lecture will be held at Dartmouth College on Tuesday, April 14, 2009 at 4:30 PM. The lecture is cosponsored by the Intercollegiate Studies Institute and *The Dartmouth Review*.

Radical Islamist groups seek to explain and justify their actions in terms of their version of Islamic teaching, law, history, and practice. Meanwhile, many Western commentators are stuck in a narrative largely shaped by obsolete categories of, globalization, ethnicity, the “West,” American foreign policy, and Middle Eastern nationalism. Consequently, we are consistently being misinformed about the nature of our enemies and the nature of the conflicts we are in.
