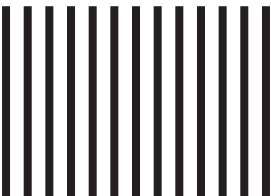

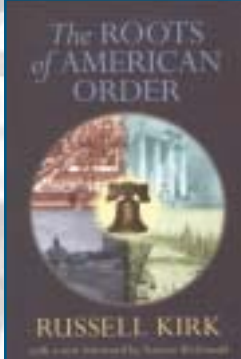
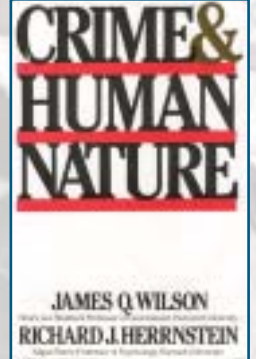
## ONLINE RESOURCES
